West End

1. West End

London's cosmopolitan West End offers a lively mixture of social activities, with pubs, clubs, shopping, theatres wine bars and cafes. Be sure to catch the street performers including talented dancers, singers and jugglers. Oxford Street is world famous for its huge lit up video billboards. It is a shoppers paradise, with over a mile long of shops ranging from enormous department stores such as Selfridges. This is shoppers delights that stretches from Marble Arch to Tottenham Court road.



3. Piccadilly circus and SoHo

London's theatreland offers a vast selection of plays, musical and concerts. A night out in the West End is an experience not to be missed !



2. Trafalgar Square

Trafalgar Square is one of London's great meeting places and was created as a monument to British naval power. The neoclassical design by John Nash provided a dramatic open space and is great access to major routes across London. Remodelled in 1840 by Sir Charles Barry. It now includes Nelson's Column and the three iconic Lions.



5. Covent Garden

Regent Street is home to many popular stores such as Hamley's one of the largest toy shops in the world. Behind these stores is the famous 1960s hippy haunt of Carnaby Street. Paved walkways blend bohemian emporiums that sell everything from posters to hand made jewellery.



4. ST Martin-in-the-Fields

Another popular tourist attraction to visit while you are at Trafalgar square is ST Martin-in-the-Fields. ST Martin-in-the-Fields is an English Anglican Georgian church located in the north east side of the square. It aired the first religious broadcast.

Buckingham Palace is still considered a family home despite being the main headquarters of the Monarch. The Queen gave birth to Prince Charles and Prince Andrews at the Palace and to this day the notices of royal births and deaths are attracted to the front railings for members of the public to read.



8. Clarence House

Another place you can visit is Clarence House, which is just a few inches away from Buckingham Palace. Clarence House is the official London residence of The Prince of Wales and The Duchess of Cornwall. Clarence House, is one of many regal residences in the capital, it has been home to generations of the royal family over the years. It was previously home to Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother, it holds a wealth of royal history within its walls. Royal fans have the opportunity to book a tour and take a peep inside.



7. The Royal Mews

While you are at the Palace you can also stop at the Royal Mews. The Royal's Mews are located in London is cool spot where you can see all transportation that is used by the royal family. From modern cars to historic 40 fairy-tale carriages and Rolls-Royces are all in the same spot.



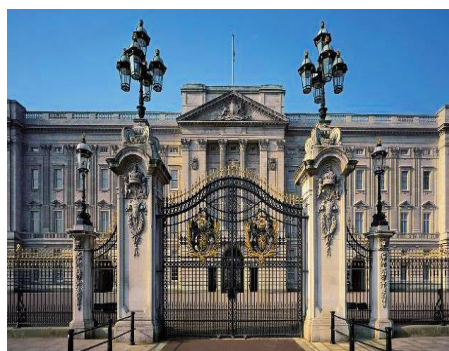
10. Changing of the Guard

You can also take a look at the Changing of the Guard. Changing of the Guard is the ceremony where The Queen's Guard hands over responsibility for protecting Buckingham Palace. It starts at 11am for 45 minutes.



9. The State Rooms

Although used for official events and receptions held by the Queen, the State Rooms are open to visitors every year in August and September when Her Majesty resides at Balmoral Castle in Scotland. The Queen's gallery is open all year-round and the Royal Mews from April till December. The Throne room has ornate ceiling which has seven glass and gold bronze chandeliers that are 200 years old.

The South Bank riverside is home to the Millennium Bridge. The popular South Bank walk has waterside pubs, restaurants and other cultural entertainment.



14.The Shard

Close to London Bridge station is Shard opened to the public in 2013. At 1,016ft it is the tallest building in the United Kingdom. The shard has a great viewing platform with amazing views of London.



12.Shakespeare Globe

The original 1599 Shakespeare Globe was known as the wooden wafters it had a circular shape and roofless centre. The theatre burned to the ground in less than two hours during a performance in 1613 a cannon ignited the thatched roof. The new global was redesigned to resemble the original with the arena open to London skies.



13.The Tate Modern

From all over the world tourists flock to Southbank to see the Tate Modern formerly an old power station it holds an impressive art collection that is situated on the Thames.



15.London Aquarium

Along the riverside is a key attraction, which is the London Aquarium. It is home to over 3500 species of underwater creature.

Museums in London

16.The British Museum

The British Museum founded in 1753 as the first national museum in the world. The British Museum contains the largest collection of treasure in Britain and welcome more than six million visitors each year. With free entry and open nearly every day of the year, the British Museum is an inspiring and educational place to visit with galleries documenting human history and celebrating different nations world-wide. With a range of both permanent and temporary exhibitions, visitors can step back in time and visit the past and delve into cultures long-since forgotten.



The British Museum

The museum's most famous objects are collections that include Roman art and sculpture, also the Sutton Hoo ship burial from Suffolk. Chinese bronze and a large collection of prints, watercolours. The Elgin Marbles from the Parthenon, the Rosetta Stone which helped decipher Egyptians hieroglyphics, The 12th century Lewis chess pieces from the Outer Hebrides, and the vast collection of Egyptian Mummies. The permanent collections hold 8 million works and is among the largest and most comprehensive in existence. The British Museum is dedicated to documenting the story of human existence, art and culture.

17.National history Museum

The National History Museum first opened its doors on 18 April 1881, and has been providing educational entertainment about history for people ever since. The Museum is filled with a wide range of specimens and dinosaurs. The museum is filled with different kinds of skeletons, fossils.



18.The Museum of London Dockland

The Museum of London Dockland is a Museum in Poplar, East London. Which tells the history of London's River Thames and the growth of Docklands since the year of 2003 it is quite the experience.



19.Science Museum

The Science Museum was founded in 1857. People have been travelling far and wide to witness their amazing discoveries ever since. With free entry open almost every day. This is an excellent place to visit; it has over 80 million specimens to explore. The Natural History Museum is a treasure trove.



20.The National Gallery

The National Gallery is an art museum in Trafalgar Square that was founded in 1824. It contains more than 100,000 portraits of the best-known faces in Britain, from politicians and sports persons.

24. Take a trip to Harrods

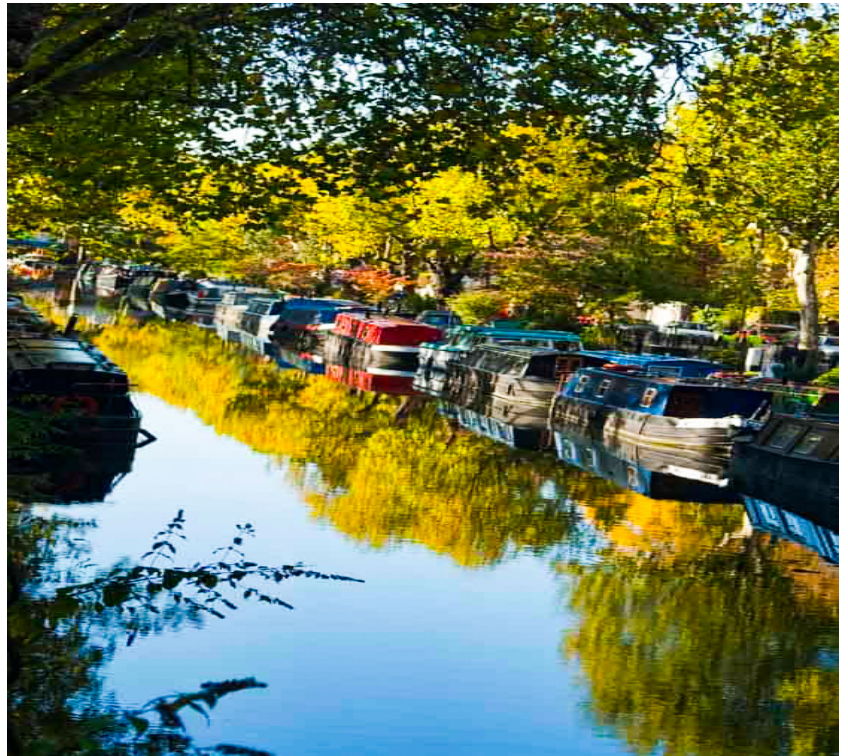
Explore the never ending food option at Harrods, Fall in love with food all over again at Harrods department store which has a department floor which offers delicate treats from all over the globe.

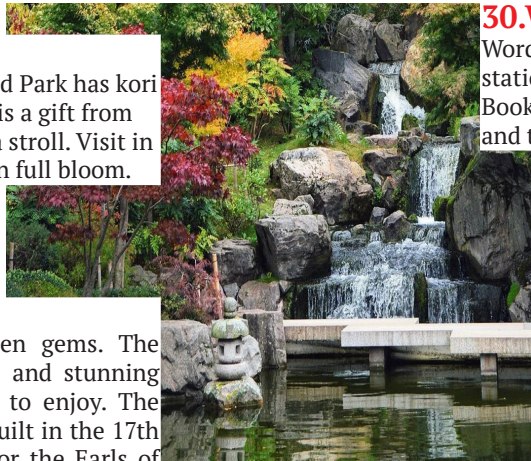


27. Golders Hill Park

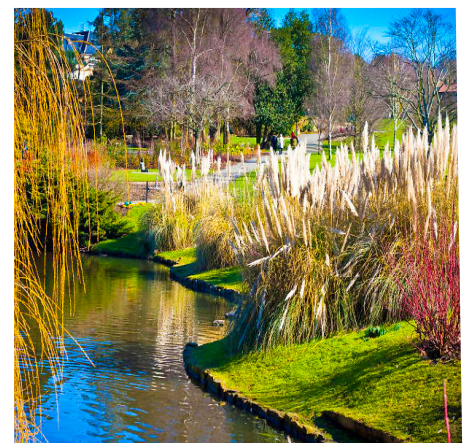
30. Word On The Water
